Family Connections Ministry Family Day Roswell Correctional Center Hagerman, NM June 14, 2025



Family Connections Ministry held a Father's Day Family Day at the Roswell Correctional Center on June 14, 2025, in Hagerman, NM. 23 inmates were cleared to attend the Family Day, 60 family members were approved, 4 inmates were helpers, 4 inmate Chaplains were in attendance, and there were 18 volunteers who were able to attend the Family Day. The volunteers came from 6 different churches and were from Albuquerque and Church on the Move in Roswell.

The Chaplain and inmate volunteers at Roswell were waiting for us and helped us quickly enter the prison. The cars were driven around to the chapel to be unloaded. The volunteers did a great job of helping set up for the Family Day. Platters of homemade cookies were filled, and family members who arrived early were asked to help with the preparations, too. Craft tables were organized, and Church on the Move had donated soft drinks and bottles of water that were put on ice in coolers.

Ann led the family members and the volunteers in mixers, and everyone got to know one another, and she taught some of the songs. Everyone had a good time before the Family Day even started!

Chaplain Wayne Brazil opened the Family Day in prayer. Ann, along with some of the inmates, their children, and volunteers, helped lead the songs – "Praise Ye the Lord" and "Shake a Neighbor's Hand". Next Ann taught the motions to "Lord, I Lift Your Name in Prayer", followed by "Jesus Love me". We all enjoyed the music so much.

The Bible story was The Prodigal Son. One of the inmates was "The Prodigal Son", his own father was "The Father", another inmate was the "Older Son", and children and volunteers were card players, dancers, and pigs in the pig field. "The Father" was pushed in his wheelchair by Chaplain Brazil when he ran to his "Prodigal Son" and hugged him and welcomed him back home in the story. What a touching and memorable time that was!

Chaplain Brazil reflected on this powerful parable and how it related to so many of us in the audience. Many could identify with both the "Prodigal Son" and the "Older Son". Later, quite a few people shared that this parable now had much more meaning to them after seeing it acted out and being part of it.

Next, the men went with their children to do crafts. Volunteers were there to assist as needed, and everyone loved making Father's Day cards and bookmarkers with markers, beautiful, unique butterflies out of the "worthless" newspaper, and fun and tasty necklaces out of fruit loops and pretzels. It's amazing how beautiful those necklaces were!

Ann invited the adults and the inmates without children to join her group. She tied the Bible story into her personal story and shared that Family Connections is designed to share Christ's love with all families of prisoners and returning citizens and connect family members in meaningful ways. Church on the Move shared about their many programs at the prison, and the Chaplain talked about all the religious programming that takes place every week. We heard from other ministry leaders and volunteers, and one of the inmate chaplains talked about that program and how he had been an inmate Chaplain at every men's prison in New Mexico.

We gathered the groups back together and sat at tables with 8 people at each table. We ate pizza, enjoyed delicious homemade cookies, and talked and shared around the table. It was a special time as usually families can't talk to one another, and the informal atmosphere was welcomed by everyone.

Then the favorite part of each Family Connections Family Day arrived. A bag of recycled "junk" was used to decorate one dad from each table in a new "Father's Day" outfit. Everyone participated in decorating their special "dad", and soon the Chapel was filled with "dads" in the most fashionable Father's Day outfits! Great fun was had by all.

The Family Day closed with everyone holding hands in a large circle around the Chapel. The Chaplain asked everyone to bow in prayer and we were reminded that Christ was born and also died for each and every one of us. It was a special, uplifting party, where joyous hearts joined together for great fun and fellowship.

Church flyers, Guideposts magazines, books, and materials from the 1687 Foundation, The Vivian Foundation, and other organizations were also distributed to everyone.
